Tobacco smoke contains over 4,000 chemicals. Here are a few of the chemicals found in cigarette smoke: cadmium (batteries); stearic acid (candle wax); hexamine (barbecue lighter); toluene (industrial solvent); nicotine (insecticides); ammonia (toilet cleaner); methanol (rocket fuel); methane (sewer gas); acetic acid (vinegar); butane (lighter fluid); and arsenic (poison). Cigarette filters are painted white.
